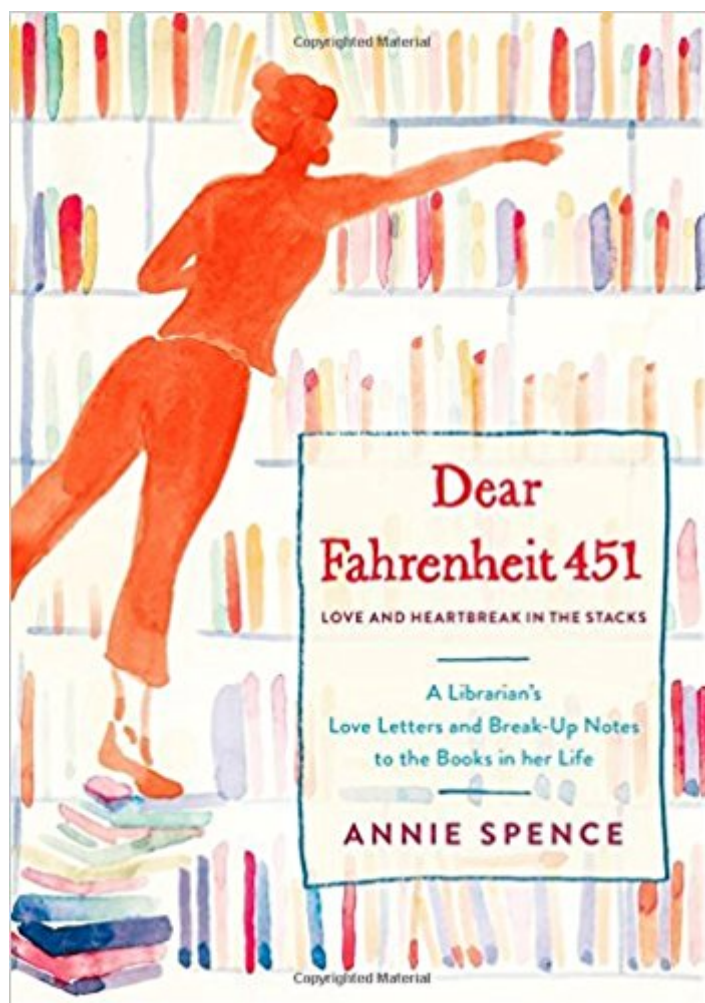

Her notes to *The Goldfinch* and *The Time Traveler's Wife* feel like classics. Through the lens of the books in her life, Annie comments on everything from feminism to health to poverty to childhood aspirations. Hilarious, compassionate, and wise, *Dear Fahrenheit 451* is the consummate book-lover's book.
