

Devotion: An Epic Story Of Heroism, Friendship, And Sacrifice



Synopsis

For readers of *Unbroken* comes an unforgettable tale of courage from America's "forgotten war" in Korea, by the New York Times bestselling author of *A Higher Call*. *Devotion* tells the inspirational story of the U.S. Navy's most famous aviator duo, Lieutenant Tom Hudner and Ensign Jesse Brown, and the Marines they fought to defend. A white New Englander from the country-club scene, Tom passed up Harvard to fly fighters for his country. An African American sharecropper's son from Mississippi, Jesse became the navy's first black carrier pilot, defending a nation that wouldn't even serve him in a bar. While much of America remained divided by segregation, Jesse and Tom joined forces as wingmen in Fighter Squadron 32. Adam Makos takes us into the cockpit as these bold young aviators cut their teeth at the world's most dangerous job—landing on the deck of an aircraft carrier—a line of work that Jesse's young wife, Daisy, struggles to accept. Deployed to the Mediterranean, Tom and Jesse meet the Fleet Marines, boys like PFC "Red" Parkinson, a farm kid from the Catskills. In between war games in the sun, the young men revel on the Riviera, partying with millionaires and even befriending the Hollywood starlet Elizabeth Taylor. Then comes the war no one expected, in faraway Korea. *Devotion* takes us soaring overhead with Tom and Jesse, and into the foxholes with Red and the Marines as they battle a North Korean invasion. As the fury of the fighting escalates and the Marines are cornered at the Chosin Reservoir, Tom and Jesse fly, guns blazing, to try and save them. When one of the duo is shot down behind enemy lines and pinned in his burning plane, the other faces an unthinkable choice: watch his friend die or attempt history's most audacious one-man rescue mission. I think of it daily; that seems crazy, but that is the case. I think of the sacrifices that these guys in the book made (especially what the Marines went through in those

There are sections in the book that literally drove me to tears, which is fairly unusual for my personality. I've been following Adam Makos books since "A Higher Call" which was a pleasure to read. The author knows how to build up tension and to "hook" the reader. His latest book "Devotion" is no exception. This lively narrative slowly introduces you to the main characters of the book and you almost feel like being right with them - may it be in the war torn skies over Korea, or down on the frozen ground with the struggling Marines. The book focuses on the fate of the two pilots and friends Tom Hudner and Jesse Brown. But we'll also get to know more faces of that conflict without drafting too much attention from the main theme. This book offers stunning insights about an almost forgotten war that still haunts its veterans and the area alike. Definitely a recommendation, not only for die-hard war history buffs!

Loved It This is a wonderful, suspenseful, and heart warming book. It is hard to put down. While the

background is the war in Korea it is not just a war book. It centers on a few carrier pilots but also includes the marine grunts from the carrier who became surrounded by the enemy and saved by the pilots who knew them. There is also a great story about their first deployment to the middle east where they were when the war started. The best part of the book is about race relations in the 50,s, which were not so good then. One of the carrier pilots just happened to be one of the few black officers in the Navy, and the first and only black Navy pilot at the time. He was a great ,first class guy and became not only one of the best pilots, but the most popular and liked pilot on the carrier. The "devotion" comes about when the black pilot crashes his plane behind enemy lines and his wingman goes to extraordinary means to help his best friend. It is very moving and shows such devotion and courage.

This is an easy to read book about Navy pilots and Marines serving in the Korean War. It covers some of the battles that were fought on the ground and from the sky. The key thread that runs through it and ties it all together is the story of two pilots who become friends while serving together. One crash lands involuntarily and the other crash lands voluntarily to help his fellow pilot who was stuck in the cockpit and was unable to free himself. This all occurred miles into enemy territory. There are a lot of pictures of the various characters in the book. I enjoyed the book very much.
