

This fully updated fourth edition includes a completely new chapter on twenty-first-century interior design and a heavily revised chapter on the late twentieth century. Interior design is a field that includes construction, architecture, furniture, decoration, technology, and product design. This one-volume history weaves together these topics in a fascinating narrative that runs from cave dwellings and temple architecture, through Gothic cathedrals and Renaissance palaces, to the grand civic spaces of the nineteenth century and the sleek interiors of modern skyscrapers. Embedded in a social and

political context, detailed discussions of famous buildings, from cathedrals to Koolhaas, are interspersed with investigations of the domestic vernacular — the cottages, farmhouses, apartments, and city terraces inhabited by ordinary people. The new edition of this bestselling history includes over fifty new images and many previously black and white images updated to color.

This is not a coffee table book of pretty interior design in history. This is an incredibly well researched and thorough accounting of interior design throughout the ages. The book begins in the prehistoric era, covering French cave drawings, Egyptian tombs and Anasazi ruins, showing the long origins of human desire to "pretty up" the home. The book then moves onto the classic civilizations, to the early Christian and Islamic traditions, and into the Renaissance, which is divided into Spanish/French, British and Italian eras. Once into the modern era, the book covers early America, Victorian era, the early century Aesthetic Movements, and into modern era (Art Deco, International and Modernism). The book covers all of the usual suspects: Le Corbusier, Bertoia, Eames, Bauhaus, Tiffany and Hoffman but also some of the lesser known but equally important

artists in the design movements. Overall, the book covers a massive range of design, giving the design or architecture student a very high level of understanding of the history of design. With oodles of illustrations and pictures (both black and white and color), this is the perfect book for any student or any serious fan of design looking for a good understanding of the history of interior design. Well organized, thorough and packed full of essential terms, designers and concepts, this is a superb jumping off point into the design world.
