People are forgetting how to use technology. First it's the latest gadgets, like mobile phones and tablet computers. Then people forget how to handle televisions and escalators. When Londoners

become paralyzed with fear at the complexity of doorknobs, the Doctor and Donna have to step in. Until, that is, this contagious fear of technology starts infiltrating the Doctor's brain. Author Matt Fitton and director Nicholas Briggs continue an important theme from Russell T. Davies' run on Doctor Who, the idea that the Doctor influences ordinary people to do something extraordinary. The Doctor prods a seemingly supernatural problem until he finds the wholly natural, but alien cause. But it takes Donna to create a plan to do something about it, and two ordinary people they rescue from the streets to make it happen. As usual with Big Finish audio productions, the sound design on this episode is breathtaking. The engineering team creates a half-haunted museum, a panicked London street, and the heart of a concealed alien vessel with equal aplomb. Though the story is necessarily dialogue-heavy, to explain developments that would otherwise be conveyed visually, the correspondence between the soundscape and dialogue is powerful. I admit slight hesitation about the story resolution. The Doctor half engineers, half falls backward into, the kind of solution that doesn't just see the enemy beaten, it sees them demolished... the kind of solution that often sent him into a brooding tailspin, or urged him to overthrow elected governments. Here, it doesn't make him pause. The story really deserved a brief pause for the Doctor's psychological fallout, just to maintain themes established on TV. This single complaint notwithstanding, I really enjoyed this story. It slots comfortably into the Doctor-Donna dynamic we love, contributing to the themes from that season, without derailing or changing the storyline we already know and love. And it's executed cleanly, so fully realized that we could imagine we're watching TV. This episode does everything we remember and love from our beloved television series. Mostly.

It is so kewl to hear David Tennant play the Doctor again, even if it is only an audio performance. He's just as energetic and full of surprises as he was when he was filming Doctor Who. Seeing the Doctor paired with Donna Noble, as played by Catherine Tate, makes it an even bigger treat. They provide the same whimsy they had before. Tate's performance is a little weaker; it sounds as though she's reading her lines for the first time. Be that as it may, she reads them with better inflection than others who have thoroughly memorized their scripts. It's also awesome to have Rachael Stirling doing another Doctor Who project; she is completely in the moment as Jill Meadows. The rest of the cast is brilliant as well. Unlike previous Big Finish CDs I've listened to, this is the soundplay only. There are no audio documentaries afterward.

Absolutely enjoyed every second of this. Big Finish does an amazing job, and I've missed having Tennant and Tate together. My only complaint was in the length. It's soooooooo short! Like a regular

episode of Doctor Who. But the product overall was excellent. Worth the buy.

Love hearing 10 in these audio dramas. DT hasn't missed a beat! You can tell he likes being The Doctor again.
