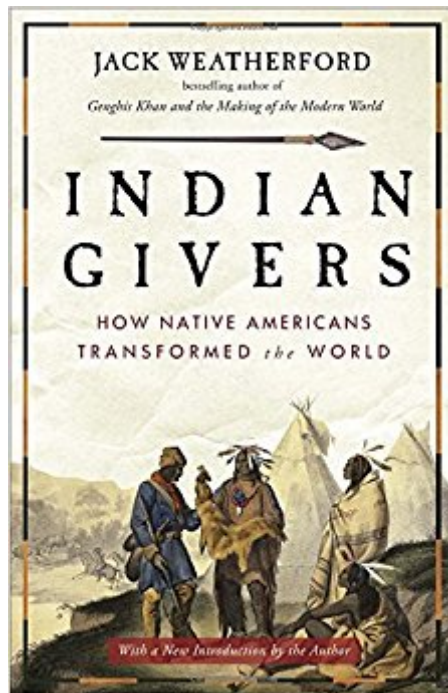




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Indian Givers: How Native Americans Transformed The World

A specialist in tribal peoples, he was for many years a professor of anthropology at Macalaster College in Minnesota and divides his time between the USA and Mongolia.

The American Indians and the Americas have provided immeasurable bounty to modern civilization, whether it be the democratic federal government system of the United States or the gold which laid the foundation for tradable currencies and thus capitalism. The author scope is wide, as he moves from food (in addition to the natural biodiversity of the American continents, the Native Americans had an excellent understanding of plant genetics and hence created a huge diversity of crops) to raw materials to the Indian-rooted ideas of the Enlightenment, communism, and anarchism. My one complaint is that the book is only lightly cited--I would prefer to follow up on interesting topics or at least see something to back up the author's claims (for example, he states that before the potato, northern European countries could not develop into powerful empires due to food insecurity with no references).

What a wonderful treasure of the many, many contributions of Native Americans to every aspect of our lives. This is certain to provide an excellent 'it's about time' insight for non-Natives and Natives alike - not to mention non-North Americans (who generally do not have much understanding of our diverse tribal cultures and institutions).
