

At the zoo, the Zebra was ready to go to sleep, but all the buzzing kept him awake. He said to the monkey, lion, and parrot, shhh,mint us time for sleep. The zebra was very tired, but the hippotamus and the giraffe were not ready for sleep. One by one he went to each animal in the zoo to ask them to go to sleep. When you read this book, you will find out what happens. Parents and teachers will enjoy reading this book to their children. It uses soothing words, and gives the children permission to close their eyes and drift off to dreamland. The illustrations by Tamia Sheldon are creative, bright and colorful. They depict each animal, and his activity in the zoo. Children of three and four will find this book just right for

The zebra is stirring in its paddock. It's bedtime at the zoo, but none of the animals seem ready for bed. The authors presents nine animals that might live in the zoo and describes their habitat and the sounds they make. Bright illustrations accompany the rhyming text. After a while, the animals finally become tired; the author repeats the information once more. Targeted for ages three the seven, I believe the book has the most appeal for preschoolers, who will enjoy imitating the schools and making the read an interactive experience after multiple readings. Bright illustrations illuminate the text.

The Zebra Said ShhhColorful children's story abou the life of a zebra. Some pages are difficult to read the words due to the background color. Lots of different animals do NOT want to go to sleep but the zebra tries to get them to listen to him. At the end it tells you where they all sleep, their habitat, 10 different animals. Other works by the author are highlighted at the end.

The Zebra Said Shhh is a bedtime picture book featuring zoo animals. The language is very repetitive and simple and therefor may do better with the young-toddler-or-under crowd.- Teneisha R. S. Jones, Author of Zoo of Emotions

Lack of rhyming verse shouldn't pose issue with most kids who encounter this interesting presentation of nighttime among a group of animals. Three stars because lack of rhythm during first half of book interferes with flow of reading (until pages where animals fall asleep). Also, two pages of boxed text at beginning and later a bit jarring when a wonderful illustration would have definitely enhanced small readers' experience of this bedtime tale. I recommend this book, but have minor concerns about its potential popularity because of the above stated reasons.

This book was recommended based on other kindle books I have purchased for my daughter. The summary seemed like something we would like and the 99 cents price was excellent. This book is great for bedtime reading. There is no rhyme per se but there is a repetitive refrain. The zebra is ready to go to sleep but the other animals in the zoo are still making noise. The book visits each of those animals' zoo habitats and the noises each makes and at the end of that encounter the "zebra says shhh it's time to go to sleep". The zoo finally settles down and the animals are revisited as they sleep. The graphics are beautiful and I would recommend this book to others.

Young children and toddlers will enjoy this story of a zebra who wants to sleep in a zoo that is too noisy. The zoo is a very vociferous place, even at night because of the monkeys, lions, parrots, turtles, seals, giraffes and more!
