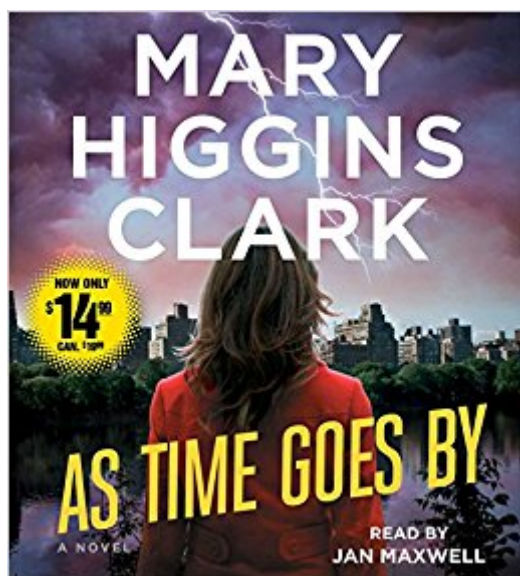


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As Time Goes By



Synopsis

Now in Encore! His substantial inheritance hangs in the balance—his only means of making good on payments he owes his ex-wife, his children, and increasingly angry creditors. The #1 New York Times bestselling author Mary Higgins Clark has written thirty-seven suspense novels, four collections of short stories, a historical novel, a memoir, and two children's books. With her daughter Carol Higgins Clark, she has coauthored five more suspense novels, and also wrote *The Cinderella Murder*, *All Dressed in White*, *The Sleeping Beauty Killer*, and *Every Breath You Take* with bestselling author Alafair Burke. More than one hundred million copies of her books are in print in the United States alone. Her books are international bestsellers.

As a new mystery writer, I am purposely reading authors with great commercial success. MHC does. I used to love her books but I think they are predictable now; readers are kept guessing to a certain degree but the outcomes are always expected. However, as I am reading to learn these days--although it is pleasurable, I find myself wanting surprises. MHC does have a good murder mystery 'recipe' but I'd like mine spicier!

I think I've read all of Mary Higgins Clark's mysteries, and I always enjoy them and come back for more. This is not one of her best books, but it is an appealing story. The two plot lines involve Betsy Grant, a woman on trial for the murder of her husband, a doctor with Alzheimer's, and Delaney Wright, a young TV reporter who is covering the trial and who wants desperately to find her birth mother. To assist in her search, Delaney seeks the help of Alvirah and Willy Meehan, recurring characters in many of Ms. Clark's books, and I found their presence very welcome here. I thought the story was somewhat slow getting started--the trial begins on page 32, but it took a while for it to become compelling. I also found it quite predictable--there was one plot development that I had not anticipated, but most of it was quite easy to figure out. There were several revelations--bombshells to the characters if not the readers--which occurred in the last line of chapters, and we never had the pleasure of seeing how the person reacted to the amazing information. In spite of these flaws, however, I found this an enjoyable story with a satisfying ending. Fans of Mary Higgins Clark will not want to miss it.

My favorite character is Sharky - he's got a lot of personality. However, he's one of the elements of luck that pervade this book. No detective work. No suspense. Just a lot of being in the right place at the right time and running into the right person who will supply the information needed, and of people behaving stupidly at the perfect time. A pleasant read, but that's about all. It ranks at the bottom of MHC's list, as far as I'm concerned.

The plot was so thin, and it so easy to figure out...there was no mystery at all. It was all too clear from the beginning how Delaney's story would pan out...same thing with Betsy. It was an enjoyable enough read, but I missed the mystery. I kept wondering as I read if I were missing something, thinking that surely there was a bigger mystery here and MHC was just baiting the reader. Alas, that was not the case. The story was too predictable, and I didn't especially love the protagonist, Delaney. She wasn't very fleshed out, and I tired of reading about her struggle to remain unbiased while reporting on the trial.

I always enjoy this author. This book is OK and a great summer read on the beach or back porch. However it is not as exciting as most other stories. I think my romantic soul did not think the male characters were well drawn. Not bad but . . .

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
